Specimen Collection and Preparation Guide

For each serum specimen, collect 5 ml of whole blood into a serum separator tube (marble or tiger top SST). A minimum of 1 ml of whole blood is needed for testing of pediatric patients.

When more than one blood specimen is required, multiple sample needles and vacuum tubes make blood collection simpler and more efficient. A tiny rubber sleeve automatically closes when the vacuum tube is removed from the holder, preventing leakage and loss of blood when the tubes are being changed. Place the sharps container within reach.
