Examples of acceptable and unacceptable face-to-face ...
Home Health Face-to-Face Documentation A physician must order Medicare home health services and must certify a patient's eligibility for the benefit. The face-to-face requirement ensures that the orders and certification for home health services are based on a physician's current knowledge of the patient's clinical condition.

Home Health Face-to-Face Documentation
• Mandated by the Affordable Care Act (ACA) • Condition for payment • Prior to certifying a patient's eligibility for the home health benefit, the certifying physician must document that he or she, or an allowed non-physician practitioner (NPP) has had a face-to-face encounter with the patient • Documentation regarding these encounters must be present on certifications for patients with starts of care on and after January 1, 2011

Medicare Home Health Face-to-Face Requirement
The physician must document the Face-to-Face clinical evaluations and re-evaluations in a detailed narrative note in their charts in the format that is used for other entries. For the initial evaluation, the report would commonly document pertinent information about the following elements, but may include other details: † History

Face-to-Face Documentation Requirements
documentation provided by the treating practitioner to support payment for the item(s) of DMEPOS. • The face-to-face encounter shall be documented in the pertinent portion of the medical record and supports payment for theitem(s). For example: o History o Physical examination o Diagnostic tests o Summary of findings o Progress notes

Standard Elements for Durable Medical Equipment ...
The Affordable Care Act (ACA) established a face-to-face encounter requirement for certification of eligibility for Medicare home health services, by requiring the certifying physician to document that he or she, or a non-physician practitioner working with the physician, has seen the patient.

For the latter, place the document face-down on the glass and close the lid. Know How, Why, and When to Document Employee Performance
If a physician has a surgical discussion with a patient after a biopsy comes back malignant the documentation may reflect: Total time of encounter: 30 minutes Twenty minutes were spent counseling patient face to face about options based on biopsy results. Discussed: Biopsy results; Surgical options; Success expectations; Post-surgical expectations

How to Document E/M with Counseling and Coordinating Care ...
It is not clear if the printed HIPAA/ADA mask exemption document was intended for employees to present to employers — but if that was the intent of some users, they might be surprised to learn their claim could preclude their ability to work and be paid "until face coverings are no longer required."

The Affordable Care Act (ACA) added a requirement that prior to such certification the physician must document that the patient had a face-to-face encounter with an allowed physician or non-physician practitioner (NPP) within a reasonable timeframe as established by the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.

The physician must document the total face-to-face time spent in separate notes throughout the day or in one cumulative note. The latter method is a more realistic option for physicians. When two providers from the same group and same specialty provide services on the same date ...

Face-to-Face (F2F) Documentation Support The Patient Protection Affordable Care Act mandates that a physician have a face-to-face encounter (in-person visit) for Medicare and Medicaid home health services. Below are the key things that you need to know. The Medicare and Medicaid Face-to-Face rule requires:

Face-to-Face (F2F) Documentation Support - UVM Health ...
Print Post A split or shared visit occurs when both a physician and a qualified non-physician practitioner (NPP) meet face-to-face with a Medicare patient on the same date of service, and the work of the physician and the NPP are "combined" into a single E/M service.

Shared Visit Documentation and Reporting - AAPC Knowledge ...
The initial (Start of Care) certification must include documentation that an allowed physician or non-physician practitioner (NPP) had a face-to-face (FTF) encounter with the patient. The FTF encounter must be related to the primary reason for the home care admission. This requirement is a condition of payment.

Home Health Face-to-Face (FTF) Encounter
This service must be related to a face-to-face E/M code, and it could be performed on the same day as the face-to-face service or on a prior or subsequent day. The 99358 code is not an add-on code ...
