In the 'Lost World' he provides an alternative interpretation of Genesis 1: that the seven days in this chapter describe a functional account of how God inaugurated an already existing cosmos to be his Temple habitat. Within this temple habitat He would rule, control, and maintain His creation.

The Lost World of Genesis One seems to suggest that Genesis 1 provides an account of the actual material creation of man. That is, God does more in Genesis 1 than give man purpose. Walton, however, does not flesh this out. (And The Lost World of Genesis One seems to contradict itself somewhat on this point.)

According to Walton, however, this view of Genesis is wrong, and the church has misunderstood its real meaning for many centuries. According to Walton, the reason why the church has almost universally misunderstood Genesis is that knowledge of the ancients and their world-view had been lost for many centuries.

In John Walton's book The Lost World of Genesis One, he puts forward a claim that the Genesis account was about Functional Origins rather than Material Origins. He claims that all of the material was already existent, and that God merely provided function to this creation.
